

DEAR JUDGE LEE:

IN DECEMBER 2005—AFTER a 10-year federal investigation and a six-month trial—a Tampa, Florida jury of his peers found Dr. Sami Al-Arian not guilty of violent "terrorism" charges, but "hung" 10-2 for acquittal on remaining nonviolent charges. On May 1, 2006, the Justice Department publicly agreed to release Dr. Al-Arian immediately, and to assist his voluntary departure from the U.S. with no other conditions, in exchange for a guilty plea to a single nonviolent offense.

Now Dr. Al-Arian is serving an extra 18-month jail sentence for refusing to testify before a grand jury. He is on a hunger strike to protest his continuing incarceration.

Please modify Dr. Sami Al-Arian's current sentence of civil contempt. Allow this professor, a respected member of the Muslim American community, to reunite with his family immediately and live abroad.

IN DECEMBER 2005—AFTER a 10-year federal investigation and a six-month trial—a Tampa, Florida jury of his peers found Dr. Sami Al-Arian not guilty of violent "terrorism" charges, but "hung" 10-2 for acquittal on remaining nonviolent charges.

On May 1, 2006, the Justice Department publicly agreed to release Dr. Al-Arian immediately, and to assist his voluntary departure from the U.S. with no other conditions, in exchange for a guilty plea to a nonviolent offense. Yet this Muslim professor, who has lived in the United States for 30 years, remains behind bars. He went on a hunger strike to protest his continued incarceration.

With the stroke of your pen, you can honor your Court's promise. Release Dr. Al-Arian so he can reunite with his family and live abroad. Our country's reputation for "justice for all" is at stake.

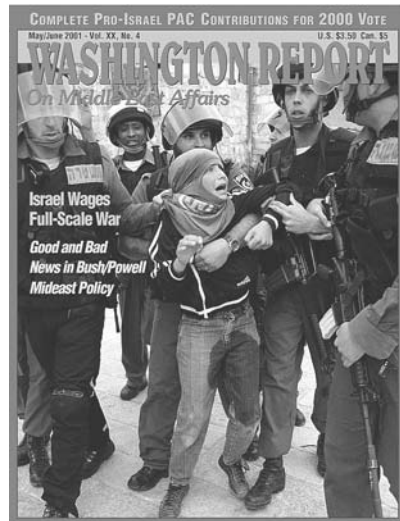
DEAR HONORABLE JOHN CONYERS, JR.:

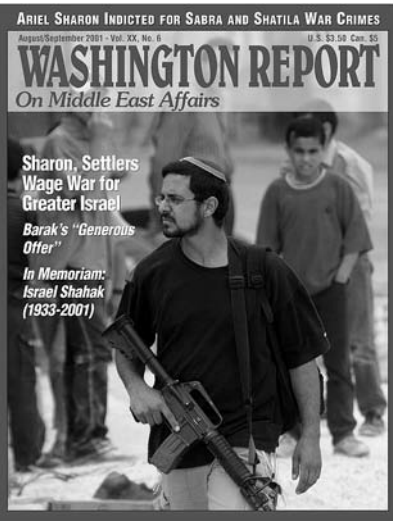

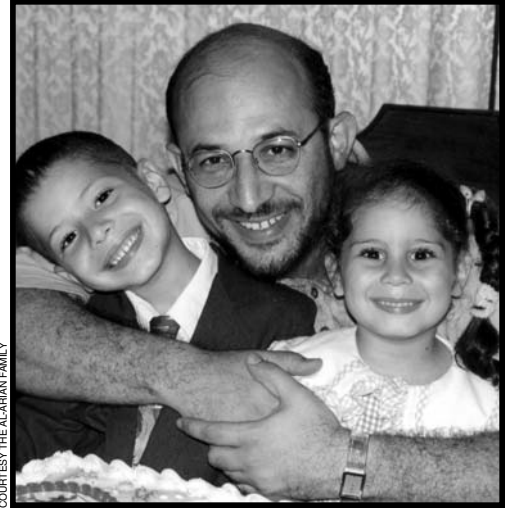

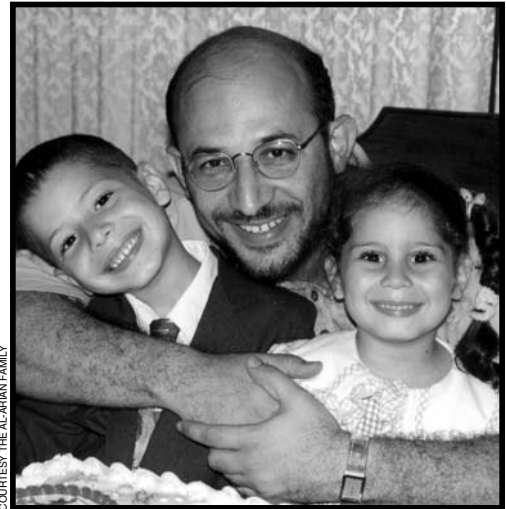
